
The Long Room is a comfortable and relaxed learning space which is available to hire for community groups and clubs.

The Greatest Show on Earth

An exhibition to coincide with the UK's celebration of 250 years of circus.

Looking at the history and traditions of circus culture and focuses on entrepreneur and showman, Lord George Sanger, and his connections to the town of Newbury.

Sanger was a colourful character who brought the flair and showmanship of the fairground to the circus and made it part of mass entertainment culture.

Beginning with small peep shows, Sanger's circus grew in popularity, even performing before Queen Victoria.

The sleepy district of West Berkshire hasn't always been so quiet, in fact it has an interesting record of historic crime.

This exhibition looks at the nature of crime and the types of punishments that were dealt between 1500 to 1914.

Discover some of the notorious felonies that were committed in West Berkshire, including the early 19th century swing riots, the murder of a labourer by two teenagers in 1787, the notorious highwaymen working the coaching roads and the reason why the owner of Shaw House nearly caused a riot in 1907.


Paper, People

Paper making has a long history in West Berkshire, starting from small mills making paper to large factories in the 20th century like Reeds, later Fields Packaging.

Fields Packaging was more than just a factory, the people employed were a community.

This community spirit is explored through photographs which document the board making and printing processes at Fields/ Reeds Factory and the strong community of the people involved.

Greenham -**War and Peace**

Celebrating Greenham Common Trust's 20th anniversary since the former RAF airbase was returned to nature.

This exhibition looks back at the unique heritage of Greenham Common, from 1199 when it was given to the Knights Hospitaller; through to tank testing during the First World War; its time as an RAF/ USAF airbase in World War 2; the Cold War missile base, the infamous peace protests of the 1980s and more recently, its transfer back to common land.



Hoards

Bringing together, for the first time, over eleven hoards from all over West Berkshire

A chance to see buried treasure from prehistory to the medieval period, ranging from a hoard of Bronze Age Axes, Iron Age gold coins, hundreds of Roman coins, to a collection of Charles I and James I coins.

Explore the history of each hoard, find out how and where they were found, and consider why they were hidden and never retrieved.

The Armourer's Dilemma:

Armour and Firearms in the British Civil Wars.

Handmade Ceramics



Open Air Sculpture Exhibition



A Brief History of Music

600 years of music in 90 minutes

Beginning in the Middle Ages and ending up in the 20th century (and incorporating everything in between!) this fun and fastmoving show is a whistle-stop tour of Western musical history.

Featuring long forgotten songs and tunes (not to mention jokes!) GreenMatthews paint a vibrant and vivid picture of our musical DNA, mixing the familiar and the obscure, the raucous and the reflective and the courtly and the commonplace.

The show combines the vigour of the medieval period, the musical intricacy of the Renaissance, the grandeur of the Baroque and the pomp and bombast of Victoriana. Add to that the wit of Blackadder and 1066 And All That and the stage is set for a veritable musical feast!




